**This year, World Mission Sunday** Next week is World Mission Sunday. Every Parish across the world will celebrate this unique Sunday. It is a global sign of the Universal Church and Mission. Your prayers and donations will help support churches, hospitals, schools and vocations in countries where the Church is beginning, where it is new. Please be as generous as possible to the collection for the Propagation of the Faith, for more than 1200 dioceses in Asia, Africa, Latin America, the Pacific Islands and some of our Canadian dioceses that depend on World Mission collection.

**St. Lawrence Religious Ed.** For years 1-8 begin this Monday, October 17 at 6:00 p.m. in St. Lawrence Church. Tara O'Neill-Ryan and Gloria Grady will be teaching combined classes this year. All students are expected to attend the classes and if attendance is poor, children will not be eligible to receive Sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation.

**There will be an evening of prayer, music and scripture:** for families and friends of those who died

while in the care of St. Martha's Regional Hospital from **February 1, 2016 – July 31, 2016**. This service will be held in the Clare Marie Auditorium (former St. Martha's Chapel) on Wednesday, **October 26, 2016 at 7:00 pm**. Refreshments will follow. We look forward to seeing you.

**St. Paul's Parish Centre Roof:** Tenders will be accepted until **October 31, 2016** for stripping and replacing the shingles on St. Paul's Parish Centre roof. These bids can be given to Fr. Allan, and will be considered by the parish pastoral council. The winning bid will not necessarily be the lowest one.

**Snow Removal Tender:** St. Paul's Parish Council invites any parishioners interested in providing snow removal and salting/sanding services for the parking area and rectory driveway over the winter months to forward a quotation no later than Nov. 1st. Please provide a fixed price quotation for the entire winter and piecemeal rates for providing this service on an "as required" basis. This position includes Church parking lot and other side of the road, Glebe house driveway and parking area, all entrances to the Church including the basement, the main doors under the canopy, 2 side doors, 2 entrances, and salting/sanding as needed. Bidders must have insurance. Quotations should identify the equipment to be used and may be mailed to Parish Council at P.O. Box 142, Havre Boucher, BOH 1P0. Both price and equipment resources will be considered in making a decision.

**Mass Cards:** It is recommended that people asking for Mass cards at wakes and in other forums add 25c to cover the cost of the card itself, in addition to the offering of \$10.00. (Please note that the parish has to pay printers for Mass cards). Also, those in charge of filling out the Mass cards must keep a careful record of the number of Mass cards given, and give that money to the pastor.

**Some thoughts about funerals and wakes:** We are beginning to see cases in our diocese of Antigonish where devout, life-long Catholics are not receiving the full rites of Christian burial, i.e., no visitation, no funeral Mass and sometimes not even a proper Christian burial. It seems that sometimes, if not often, the surviving children of the deceased make this decision contrary to the wishes of the deceased because (1) The survivors have little or no appreciation of the value of the Church's sacraments and funeral rites, and (2) The deceased did not make their wishes for the funeral rites of the Church crystal clear before they died. Therefore, it is highly recommended that all practicing Catholics put down **in writing** their wishes respecting the wake, funeral Mass, treatment of the body (i.e. embalment and/or cremation) and Christian burial in a consecrated graveyard. Copies of your wishes could be given to next of kin, funeral directors or a trusted person. If you decide you don't want a time for visitation, one of the unintended consequences is that you will likely get few, if any, Masses offered for your soul. Finally, we remind everyone that absolutely no one has the right to go into a graveyard and bury the remains of a loved one without proper permission and a short burial service conducted by the parish priest or a designated priest or deacon.
