<u>Guidelines on Communion Reception Catholics</u>, fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when they receive Holy Communion. A Catholic should not receive Communion if they are conscious of grave sin and normally should have fasted one hour. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession except for a grave reason where there is no opportunity for confession.

Our fellow Christians (Anglicans, Protestants) are welcome to the celebration of Mass as brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and action in the Holy Spirit will one day heal our divisions. Because Catholics believe that Mass is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are not admitted to holy communion. If one day we achieve true unity, then we will all receive from the one Body and Blood of Christ. But until that day, Anglicans, Protestant and other churches cannot receive communion in a Catholic Mass, nor should Catholics receive communion in non-Catholic churches.

Burial Plots at St. Lawrence Cemetery: Our policy states that a new plot at St. Lawrence Cemetery costs \$200.00, regardless of whether that new plot is used for a full casket or the cremains of the deceased. If cremains are buried in an existing grave, the cost is \$100.00. We ask that you pay by cheque to St. Lawrence Cemetery Fund. Receipts will be issued. This is necessary for the upkeep of the cemeteries. **Please Note:** It is forbidden to bury cremains in our cemeteries without permission of the pastor. Such unauthorized burials are disrespectful to the Church and to the deceased.

<u>St. Lawrence Parish needs a Religious Education Coordinator</u>: to guide the religious education program in the parish. This position does come with a small stipend The Coordinator would be tasked with trying to get Catechists (with Fr. The Advent Wreath (A brief explanation)

The word 'Advent' is from the Latin adventus for "coming" and is associated with 4 weeks of preparation for Christmas. The wreath is made of a circle of evergreen branches laid flat to symbolize eternal life. Four candles (3 purple and 1 pink) stand in the circle and each one represents one of the four Sundays of Advent. In the centre of the circle is a fifth candle (white), the Christ Candle, which is lit on Christmas Day. The wreath symbolizes the crown-like character, to remind us of Jesus. 1st Sunday of Advent – The first candle symbolizes "HOPE", Purple candle. We can have hope because God is faithful and will keep his promises to us. 2nd Sunday of Advent – The second candle reminds us that Jesus, the Prince of "PEACE", came to bring us spiritual peace
