Freedom to Marry As Taught by the Catholic Church: Marriage between a Catholic and a baptized non-Catholic.:

- <u>1)</u> For a Catholic to marry a baptized Christian from another denomination, a dispensation from the Bishop is required. In our diocese this authority has been delegated to the priest of the parish where the wedding occurs.
- 2) All other requirements apply i.e., legal age; not be previously married (and this applies to the baptized Protestant, Angligan, or other as well as the Catholic party); maturity.3
- 3) With permission of the Bishop or Ordinary, a Catholic ay be married in the non-Catholic party's Church before a non-Catholic minister. A priest is not required to be present at this ceremony for the wedding to be considered valid by the Catholic Church. However, the couple are required to see the local Catholic Pastor to fill out the required paper work and get permission a note might be added to the margins of the Catholic party's baptismal records indicating they were validly married to the non-Catholic party, with location and date of wedding also listed.
