**Lyme Disease Awareness,** this disease is endemic to all areas of Nova Scotia affecting many of our citizens. Lyme Disease is carried by black legged ticks which carry the Lyme bacteria ( Borrelia Burgdorferi). is carried by mice, squirrels, birds and other small animals. It can be passed to humans when ticks feed on infected animals, become infected themselves and then bite people. When a tick bites, it becomes attached to your skin by its mouth parts. Use tweezers to remove it. Grasp the tick's head and mouth parts as close to the skin as possible and pull slowly until the tick is removed. It is a debilitating disease which attacks major organs of the body and if left unchecked it robs its victims of any quality of life. You will find here a few suggestions to minimize the risk of Lyme Disease. 1. Wear light-colored, long-sleeved shirts and pants while in the woods or in tall grass areas. 2. Tuck your shirt into your pants and pull your socks up over your pant legs. This will keep ticks away from bare skin. 3. Wear boots that cover your entire foot. Do not wear sandals or open shoes. 4. Spray clothing and exposed skin with an insect repellent that contains DEET. 5. After finishing your outdoor activities, check your clothing and your entire body for any attached ticks.
