**Burial Plots at St. Lawrence Cemetery:** Our policy states that a new plot at St. Lawrence Cemetery costs \$200.00, regardless of whether that new plot is used for a full casket or the cremains of the deceased. If cremains are buried in an existing grave, the cost is \$100.00. We ask that you pay by cheque to St. Lawrence Cemetery Fund. Receipts will be issued. This is necessary for the upkeep of the cemeteries. **Please Note:** It is forbidden to bury cremains in our cemeteries without permission of the pastor. Such unauthorized burials are disrespectful to the Church and to the deceased.

**Who may receive Holy Communion: at Catholic Mass,** (or outside of a Mass, e.g. when Communion is brought to the sick in hospital or to the residence of a nursing home or senior's building? The Church is quite clear on this question. To receive Holy Communion one must be a baptized Catholic who has reached the age of reason (age 7), and who is in a state of grace (i.e., they are not conscious of having committed a mortal sin, or have confessed that sin to a priest, and have received absolution). People who belong to another Christian denomination (e.g., United Church of Canada; Anglican; Presbyterian; Lutheran; Methodist; Salvation Army, etc.) are welcome to receive to the Eucharistic celebration, but **cannot** be welcomed to receive Holy Communion. Besides the obvious problem of them not believing that the consecrated species is the Real Presence of Jesus Christ, their receiving Holy Communion is a false sign of unity. We have not achieved unity with these other churches. They remain our **separated** brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ. The priest or deacon would be pleased to offer them a blessing if they present themselves with arms crossed over their chests, but they should not present themselves for Holy Communion, in respect for the laws of our Catholic faith. Further more, a Catholic should not receive Communion in an Anglican or Protestant Church, as this also is a false sign of unity. Simply because the minister invites everyone to receive does not mean that you should.

### **Note from Bishop Dunn**

Thank you to all who contacted me during the past few weeks regarding the glebe house at Havre Boucher. I appreciate all the concerns that parishioners mentioned, including the need for our pastor to have an appropriate place to live, the fact that parishioners are ready to support the building of a new glebe house, as well as the historic dimension of the present glebe house. The building of a new glebe house in Havre Boucher is connected to two issues: 1) the need for appropriate living quarters for your present pastor;

2) How do Havre Boucher and Tracadie and connected parishes work together in the future and deal with pastoral issues, including where the priest might live in this new reconfiguration. Thus, a decision to deal with the first issue, does not automatically deal with the second issue. Therefore, a decision to build a new glebe house is not a decision that the priest, who will serve these parishes in the future, will indeed live in Havre Boucher. Thanks again for your letters.
